ADVOCACY



ADVOCACY

ODHA advocates on your behalf on issues related to regulations, dental hygiene scope of practice in Ontario, oral health, and access to health care.

Scope of Practice

- In September 2025, the Ontario government announced a consultation on scope changes for RDHs and several other regulated health professions.

ODHA has been working to advance the scope of practice to enable RDHs to:

- prescribe radiographs;
- be a Radiation Protection Officer; and
- prescribe and administer local anesthesia by injection in the orofacial complex

This announcement resulted from a combined initiative between the ODHA and the College of Dental Hygienists of Ontario (CDHO).

On September 25, 2025, ODHA shared proposed responses with its members to help them prepare their own submissions. In addition to ODHA's submission on dental hygiene scope, ODHA also supported the denturists' request for an expanded scope.

In January 2026, ODHA submitted our response to the government's pre-budget consultation. In our response, we focused on the research demonstrating the safety of local anesthesia administration by RDHs.

In May 2026, the Minister of Health Sylvia Jones directed CDHO to begin the necessary work to move forward with scope of practice changes for RDHs. These future changes will increase the public's access to comprehensive oral health care.

Canadian Dental Care Plan

- In August 2025, Marg Harrington, ODHA CEO, was invited to meet with staff of the Office of the Auditor General (OAG) to provide feedback on the scope of its upcoming audit of the Canadian Dental Care Plan (CDCP). The federal auditors later met with the ODHA Board on September 5, 2025. During these meetings, ODHA identified several improvements we would like to see to the CDCP, including increasing the number of scaling units for all clients to 12 units per year, removing the administrative burden associated with preauthorization requests, placing greater focus on prevention, and enhancing communication to CDCP recipients to provide clarity about what is and is not covered.



ADVOCACY

Addressing the Narrative Perceived Shortage of RDHs

- In March 2026, Marg Harrington was interviewed by the Cornwall Standard-Freeholder regarding a labour plan survey by the Eastern Ontario Training Board that specifically mentioned an incoming and current labour shortage of RDHs. [The article can be accessed here.](#)

Expand Access to Infection Prevention and Control Supplies

- ODHA has been actively engaging with Supply Ontario (an agency of the Government of Ontario) to expand access to IPAC products available to dental hygiene practice owners.

Support for Degree Completion Program

- In May 2026, ODHA responded to Durham College's survey on its proposed Honours Bachelor of Science Degree Completion in Dental Hygiene. In June 2026, ODHA provided a letter of support for the program for government submission. The proposed program would be offered fully online and open to graduates of Ontario-accredited dental hygiene programs, including publicly funded and private colleges.

Ontario Special Olympics

- As part of our ongoing relationship with Special Olympics, ODHA advertised volunteer opportunities for the Special Smiles program at the Special Olympics Ontario School Championships games in London, Ontario, in May 2026.

Virtual meetings with members

October 2025 – Education Pathways Townhall

The townhall meeting on education pathways for RDHs familiarized members with a range of educational and career options available to those seeking to expand their skill sets and qualifications. The event showcased the education and career pathways of five RDHs who returned to school and advanced into roles in education, research, and restorative dental hygiene.

November 2025 – Long-Term Care (LTC) Townhall

The townhall meeting, Long-Term Care (LTC) – Getting to Know the LTC Client, gave members a clear overview of the role of LTC homes within Ontario's health-care system. It also explored common misconceptions about the typical LTC client, highlighted the frailty of residents, and provided useful context for RDHs interested in dental hygiene practice in LTC settings.

January 2026 – Temporomandibular Disorders Q&A

In April 2025, ODHA launched a free course for members on temporomandibular disorders. This comprehensive three-part course, presented by Dr. Sidney Lisser, lead clinician at the Jaw & Facial Pain Centre in Toronto, as well as Dr. Amelia Edmonds and Dr. Brittany Kucharski, was designed to equip RDHs with the knowledge and skills to understand, assess, and manage musculoskeletal orofacial pain in clinical settings.

March 2026 – Dementia Friendly Communities

Presented by the Alzheimer Society Southwest Partners, this Dementia Friendly Communities webinar offered practical, person-centred strategies to help RDHs feel more confident and prepared when caring for people living with dementia. During this session, attendees learned how to:

- Recognize common signs and symptoms of dementia.
- Understand how dementia affects communication, behaviour, and the oral health care experience.
- Create more supportive, dementia friendly practice environments.
- Explore ways to take action individually and collectively.

It's NOT All in Your Head: Oral Health and Mental Health

Presented by Jo-Anne Jones, RDH, FIADFE. Sponsored by [Philips](#).

This thought-provoking course provides RDHs with an understanding of the scope of mental health conditions within Canada. It also explores the various ways periodontitis and chronic inflammation may contribute to mental health conditions and identifies the role of RDHs in knowledgeably supporting clients with mental health conditions.

This course is part II in the series. Part I, entitled It's ALL In Your Head: Oral Health and Brain Health, explored the connection between Alzheimer's disease, dementia, and oral health.

Preventing Work-Related Musculoskeletal Disorders in Dental Hygiene Practice
