Course Descriptions

1. Speed Dating with Ultrasonic Technology

Unlock the secrets to quicker, more effective periodontal debridement
Presented by Dani Botbyl, RDH – 2 hours

Ultrasonic instruments get only seconds to prove themselves in this fast-paced, speed-dating-style workshop. Participants will rotate through instruments, power settings, and techniques, quickly deciding what works, what doesn't, and what deserves a second chance. Old favourites, new contenders, and polarizing opinions all enter the mix as clinicians confront deposit challenges by completing dry and wet activities. Work hard, judge critically, and leave with clear matches which earn a permanent place on your tray.

Learning Objectives:

- Select and justify ultrasonic instruments that demonstrate improved efficiency, preserve root structure, and elevate client comfort.
- Demonstrate precise ultrasonic active tip angulation, adaptation, and activation to support safe, efficient, and predictable clinical outcomes.
- Differentiate appropriate power settings for soft and hard deposit challenges based on real-time clinical performance.

2. The Sharpening Lab™: The Fine Edge – Techniques for Precision and Longevity

Presented by Kathleen Bokrossy, RDH, BSc – 2 hours

The Sharpening Lab™ is an immersive, hands-on workshop that transforms sharpening from an avoided task into a confident clinical skill. Through live demos, guided practice, and interactive learning stations, participants will learn how to evaluate instruments, restore precise cutting edges, and make smart decisions about maintenance, repair, and replacement—all while improving ergonomics and clinical efficiency.

Participants are encouraged to bring their own instrument cassette to work on during the session, including an anterior sickle, posterior sickle, universal curette, and Gracey curettes. Kathleen will also have instruments available; however, working on your own instruments allows you to assess their current condition, sharpen what is clinically appropriate, and return to practice with a set of instruments that are not only properly sharpened—but calibrated to your hand and your technique.

Learning Objectives:

- Evaluate dental hygiene instruments for sharpness, bevel wear, safety, and overall clinical performance.
- Apply correct sharpening principles, including angulation, positioning, and stroke control, to restore precise and efficient cutting edges.
- Differentiate between instruments that should be sharpened, recontoured, retired, or replaced.
- Demonstrate improved confidence and consistency in manual sharpening through guided hands-on practice.
- Implement a practical, repeatable system for ongoing instrument maintenance and longevity in clinical practice.

3. Interim Stabilization Therapy (IST): Practical Application for Registered Dental Hygienists

Presented by Kim Lawrence, RDH, BA – 2 hours

Interim Stabilization Therapy (IST) offers registered dental hygienists a practical, minimally invasive approach to managing dental caries when access to definitive dental treatment is limited.

This hands-on session will explore the clinical application, indications, and limitations of IST, with a focus on pediatric, geriatric, and underserved populations.

Participants will gain clear insight into the College of Dental Hygienists (CDHO) scope of practice, ethical considerations, and real-world application of temporary restorative materials. Through hands-on practice and case-based learning, you'll build confidence in IST techniques, glass ionomer material selection, and clinical decision-making using the ADPIE process. Attendees will leave with practical strategies they can immediately integrate into practice.

Learning Objectives:

- Understand the clinical application and purpose IST, including indications, contraindications, and benefits for pediatric, geriatric, and underserved populations.
- Demonstrate knowledge of CDHO scope of practice related to temporary restorations.
- Develop proficiency in the clinical technique for IST application.
- Evaluate the benefits and limitations of glass ionomer materials in IST.
- Apply the ADPIE process to IST cases in community settings.
