## Vaccine prioritization

With the updated Ministry of Health's <u>COVID-19 Guidance for Prioritizing Health-Care Workers for COVID-19 Vaccination</u> now including oral health professionals, it's important to note the vaccine distribution details will come from individual public health units throughout the province. Understandably, the current focus is on health-care workers in hospitals, long-term care and retirement homes, and other settings caring for seniors. As more doses of the vaccines become available, it's good news to know oral health professionals are now included in the next priority group. Based on the Ontario government announcement today, January 13, 2020, vaccinations for this expanded group of health-care workers are likely not to begin until April when an increased supply of vaccine doses are received. ODHA will keep you informed as more information becomes available.
