#### What made you want to become a dental hygienist?

Having worked in sales for almost nine years before COVID changed multiple aspects of our lives, I took a step back to review my career development plan and goals. Considering that I had intended to go to medical school in college but never fulfilled that aspiration, I began researching approaches that would give me a second chance at working in the health care profession. After collecting sufficient data on various potential options, I decided to pursue a career in dental hygiene. This choice doesn't require extensive schooling, offers a variety of career trajectories, and aligns with my ambition of becoming a health care professional.

#### What type of practice setting do you hope to work in?

Having worked as an employee for nearly nine years, I believe it's the right time to purse a career as an independent contractor. I plan to kick-start my dental hygiene career by temping at various dental offices, from general practices to periodontal clinics. After one year of clinical practice, I intend to expand my skill set by taking a continuing education course in orthodontics, which I hope will lead to new opportunities for enhanced patient care and professional advancement. In the meantime, I am keen on continuing to deliver oral hygiene education workshops at multiple community centers.

#### How will you celebrate your graduation?

I believe it's too early to celebrate my graduation, as I still need to prepare for the board exam and obtain licensure with the regulatory body. When I pass the exam, I'll celebrate by taking a short trip to Niagara-on-the-Lake.
