The practice is prevention-focused and has a strong mentorship culture. The dentist and team truly respect the role of the dental hygienist—not just as a clinician or educator, but as a healthcare professional in their own right. I'll be part of oral health campaigns, fluoride programs in schools, and will assist in managing patients with periodontal disease in collaboration with the periodontist. It's more than just a job—it's a dream opportunity that aligns perfectly with my values and vision.

How will you celebrate your graduation?

Graduation is more than a milestone for me—it's a symbol of resilience, adaptation, and hard work. I plan to celebrate with the people who supported me from the moment I stepped off the plane: my family, close friends, and classmates who became like family during this intense journey.
