IPAC I-SPY: Spotting Risks

Michelle Aube-Simmonds, RDH | Maxill, Fanshawe College, ODHA Board Member

In the early years of practice, Infection Prevention and Control decisions are often influenced by routine, time pressure, and workplace habits. Developing IPAC leadership requires the ability to quickly recognize risk, distinguish between evidence-based standards and assumption-driven practices, and respond with clarity and confidence. IPAC I-SPY: Spotting Risks is an interactive, image-based roundtable session designed to strengthen early-career Registered dental hygienists' ability to identify compliance gaps and apply evidence-informed solutions in real time. Participants will analyze a series of realistic clinical IPAC images reflective of everyday practice environments.

By the end of this session, participants will be able to:

1. Identify visible IPAC risks within common clinical environments.
2. Apply evidence-based reasoning to determine appropriate mitigation strategies.
3. Strengthen confidence in making defensible IPAC decisions in early practice settings.
